WHERE DID THE KIDS GO?

MSC Cruises, the largest privately-owned cruising company in the world, owes its position as a leader in the world's fastest growing tourist market to its innovative approach when it comes to catering for families. The ships offer different clubs for children in three different age groups - 3 to 6, 7 to 12, and 13 to 17 – with customised activities, from arts and crafts to video games and a disco, to keep them busy all day.

The children's club is available from 9am to 2am, which means that parents don't have to take turns watching the kids, something that would be unfair to them both on any other trip. Instead, they can leave their children in total supervision and with the peace of mind to do their own thing. (Kids also get to enjoy their own fun



meals together in case they're too young to appreciate gourmet Mediterranean cuisine.)

So, once the kids are taken care of, what can the parents do on their well-deserved break? Quite a lot! On the sporting side, the ships offer a range of facilities, including an openair jogging track, virtual golf simulator, and a fully-equipped gym, where I got lost in the 180-degree ocean view and could have sworn I saw a mermaid (or maybe it was just a dolphin). There are also dedicated pools and sun decks that are completely kid-free, with spa baths that are great for relaxing aching feet that danced the night away.

For those who prefer taking it easy on holiday, you can skip the gym and go directly to the luxury spa. Time really

does melt away when you're lounging on heated chairs in a relaxation room overlooking the ocean, getting hypnotised by the endless waves. And don't be surprised if a year's worth of stress vanishes after a onehour massage from a Balinese woman who knows how to find all your knots! It really is the perfect way to pamper yourself, restore your wellbeing, and rejuvenate body and mind.

And then there's the entertainment. Aside from around a dozen themed bars, a casino, and a selection of duty-free shops, what I loved most was the ship's massive theatre, which put on a new show after dinner every night. Despite the challenge of using a limited cast to create entertainment that caters to a wide

variety of tastes, the babes and hunks of the All Star Dancers achieved remarkably well in giving local audiences the kind of international performances they haven't seen before.

On my four-night cruise, the shows were Bella Italia (celebrating the cruise company's Mediterranean heritage) Burlesque (think Moulin Rouge), Fantasia (a fusion of Japanese, Spanish, Arabian and Indian culture), and One Night Only (Las Vegas magic and feathers). For a guy who sees around a dozen shows a month, I was quite impressed by the high production values and could see why so many people in the audience couldn't get enough!
